Effective December 1, 2003, they are as follows:

**Revision to Continuing Education Requirements 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 76.220(a)**

*“A licensed driller or pump installer is required to show proof of four (4) hours of continuing education per year with one (1) hour dedicated to the Water Well Driller/Pump Installer Statutes and Rules. Only courses approved by the Department can be used to satisfy this requirement.”*

In addition, apprentice registration renewals and applications for apprenticeships must have an attached certificate of completion of the Water Well Drillers/Pump Installers Statutes and Rules course.

Revised Apprenticeship Requirements Effective October 1, 2004

*“Upon completion of a training program of at least two (2) years, an apprentice may apply to obtain a well driller’s and/or pump installer’s license or renew the status as an apprentice. Upon renewal of an apprentice registration, the supervising driller and/or pump installer shall provide the Department a written progress report on the training segments in 76.205(f)(3) pertaining to the apprentice’s stated training program. A one (1) hour Certificate of Completion of the Water Well Driller/Pump Installer Statutes and Rules course shall accompany each apprentice registration renewal.”*

Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) – Austin, Texas

***\*“Water Well Driller/Pump Installer Statutes and Rules Course” Course # 2658***

This course will cover new water well drillers regulations and proposed future regulations. **This course is required** for renewal of license for water well drillers, pump installers and apprentices. This course of instructions qualifies as credit for water well drillers, pump installers and apprentices. ***\* Course qualifies for required hour for rules & regulations***

**8:30 a.m.-9:30 a.m. (1 hour credit)**

***“Groundwater Districts Management in Texas/Developing Desired Future Conditions” Course #2664***

The purpose of this course is to familiarize water well drillers with groundwater conservation districts in Texas and with the requirements of districts that may impact a drillers’ date-to-day business operations including their rules and regulations and the desired future conditions of aquifer which could limit drilling and withdrawal. This course of instructions qualifies as credit for water well drillers and pump installers.

**9:30 a.m.-10:30 a.m. (1 hour credit)**

***“TXDOT Load Securement” Course #2665***

Brief overview of Load Securement (General Requirements), tide down requirements, working load limits of tie downs, edge protection and how to figure if you have enough tie downs for the load you are carrying. This course of instructions qualifies as credit for water well drillers and pump installers.

**10:30 a.m.-11:30 a.m. (1 hour credit)**

***“Groundwater Districts in Texas” Course #2660***

The purpose of this course is to familiarize water well drillers with groundwater conservation districts in Texas and with the requirements that districts may adopt that would impact a driller’s day-to-day business operations. This course will cover rules and regulations of groundwater districts in Texas. This course of instructions qualifies as credit for water well drillers and pump installers.
