IF YOU ARE USING ANY COURSES APPROVED FOR OTHER STATES, PLEASE COMPLETE THE REGISTRATION FORM AND PUT YOUR LICENSE NUMBER (ALONG WITH YOUR TEXAS LICENSE NUMBER) ON THE FORM.

Effective December 1, 2003, they are as follows:

Revision to Continuing Education Requirements 16 Tex. Admin. Code Ch. 76.220(a)

“A licensed driller or pump installer is required to show proof of four (4) hours of continuing education per year with one (1) hour dedicated to the Water Well Driller/Pump Installer Statutes and Rules. Only courses approved by the Department can be used to satisfy this requirement.”

In addition, apprentice registration renewals must have an attached certificate of completion of the Water Well Drillers/Pump Installers Statutes and Rules course.

Revised Apprenticeship Requirements Effective October 1, 2004,
“Upon completion of a training program of at least two (2) years, an apprentice may apply to obtain a well driller’s and/or pump installer’s license or renew the status as an apprentice. Upon renewal of an apprentice registration, the supervising driller and/or pump installer shall provide the Department a written progress report on the training segments in 76.205(e)(3) pertaining to the apprentice’s stated training program. A one (1) hour Certificate of Completion of the Water Well Driller/Pump Installer Statutes and Rules course shall accompany each apprentice registration renewal.”
