“Groundwater Districts in Texas” WDPI Course #6974b

This course will cover groundwater resource information, evaluating geological setting and aquifer characteristics and groundwater availability determination. This course of instructions qualifies as credit for water well drillers, pump installers, apprentices and geoscientists.

“Groundwater Management in Texas-Overview of State Law” WDPI Course #6971

This course will describe the roles of local and state government in the management of groundwater. The purpose, function and funding of groundwater conservation districts are described. Methods for the creation of districts are provided and discussed. The general affects of groundwater districts activities with regard to water wells and well drillers are outlined. The purposes, definitions and resulting requirements for the designation of ground water management areas and priority management areas are described. This course of instructions qualifies as credit for water well drillers, pump installers, apprentices and geoscientists

“Desired Future Groundwater Management in Texas” WDPI Course #7154

The purpose of this course is to familiarize water well drillers and with the groundwater conservation districts in Texas and with the requirements of districts that may impact a drillers' day-to-day business operations including their rules and regulation and the desired future conditions aquifer which could limit drilling and withdrawal. This program will also include rules on flow meters. This course of instructions qualifies as credit for water well drillers, pump installers, apprentices and geoscientists.
